



What to take checklists

Suggested clothes packing checklists

Casual clothes for sightseeing, shopping or just lazing on the ship

Choose comfortable clothes but make sure that they protect you from the sun (or the cold) and that, if the sightseeing involves climbing steps or hills, you wear safe and rugged footwear.

- Shorts
- Chinos or jeans
- Sundresses
- Skirts
- T-shirts
- Casual shirts
- Light sweaters/cardigans
- Comfortable shoes/sandals
- Hat
- Sun cream
- And of course warmer clothes depending on where and when you are travelling

Swimming or relaxing on the beach

Protection from the sun is paramount. Make sure that your over-clothes (shirts or sun-dresses) actually do protect you – but wear plenty of waterproof high-factor sun cream as well.

- Swimsuit under a shirt, sundress or shorts and t-shirt or summer casual shirt
- Sandals/flip flops
- A beach bag for items such as book, camera, sunglasses, sun cream, water.
- It's a good idea to take a light weight towel (super-absorbent)
- Hat
- Sun cream

Evening Wear - Semi Formal

- Dresses
- Skirts
- Blouses
- Shirts
- Trousers
- Jackets
- Ties
- Ladies' accessories
- Shoes

Evening Wear - Formal

- Formal Dresses
- Formal Skirts
- Dress Shirts
- Dinner Jacket and Trousers
- Bow Ties
- Men's accessories (cufflinks, suspenders, etc)
- Ladies' accessories
- Shoes

Warmer clothes

- Remember that some areas inside the ship and ashore can be quite cool when air conditioned so you may want a jacket or cardigan/jumper for both day and evening.
- If you are going to colder climes then cold-weather outdoor wear will also be essential (including over-coats, scarves, gloves, ear-muffs, and so on)

Other packing checklists

Electronic equipment

- Still camera
- Video camera
- Charger for still camera
- Charger for video camera
- Films or memory sticks/cards for still/video cameras
- Lenses/filters/microphones where appropriate
- Laptop computer
- Charger for laptop
- PDA
- Charger for PDA
- Wi-Fi card (if necessary)

Cell-phone stuff

- Cell-phone/mobile
- Charger
- Extra SIM cards if appropriate

Medical/Toiletries

- Sun cream
- Mosquito/insect lotion
- Shampoo
- Conditioner
- Body wash/shower gel
- Personal ointments/medication
- Painkillers
- Acid stomach tablets
- Diarrhoea treatment

It's also a very good idea to take a couple of small bottles of antibacterial hand gel – it is a good way to avoid those annoying stomach infections that can be spread by touch.
